Cel tic Mission to Assisi



These can be done with either single-color or overdyed fibers of your choosing. Use 2 strands of embroidery floss or single strand of metallic for all stitching. Cross stitches represented by '#'. Backstitching represented by solid lines.

Stitch count: 37x37




